Registered Tangible Cultural Property of Japan Former Horibe Residence

This compound was built by a samurai family that served the lords of Inuyama Castle for generations.

The builder's inscription says the main house was built in 1883. Its first resident owner was Katsushiro Horibe (1832–1907).

There is also an attached annex, a connecting corridor, a storehouse, a workhouse (with a silkworm nursery), and a high wall, each of which is a Registered Tangible Cultural Property of Japan as of 2006.

This priceless piece of history features examples of a warrior's personal taste throughout the compound and provides a timeline of how the family assisted Japan's modernization through its contribution to the silk industry.
