This residence belonged to a merchant family that ran a kimono business under the name Kashiwaya Magobei dating back to the Edo Period. The family switched to making and selling tea after WWII.

Comprises the house, back parlor, storehouse, rear storehouse, and storage room (now used as an exhibition room). Originally built in the mid-to-late 1800s and subsequently renovated several times.

Registered as a Tangible Cultural Property of Japan in 2005.

The only one of Inuyama's machiya townhouses to feature a distinctive curved roof.
